### **Overview of the Industry**


Sisal is predominantly grown by ten (10) sisal estates spread across the Coast, Eastern and Rift Valley regions of the country. Small pockets of production by Smallholder growers are spread all over the arid and semi-arid lands of the country, forming about 5% of the total production. This sisal is mainly grown along the boundary and hedge rows.

## **Production by county**

During the period under review a total of 29,268.11 MT of fibre was produced out of which 28,463.30 MT was exported while the rest being locally sold to sisal factory for manufacture of twine/yarn, ropes and coffee drying clothes. *See Table 1 for details* 

In comparison to the previous year, production was higher during the period under review by about 10% as indicated in *Graph 1 below* 

This could be attributed to improved weather conditions during the year under review.

The Estates produced the bulk of the fibre, a total of 28,132.50 MT while the smallholder produced a meagre 1,135.71 MT during the period under review as shown in *Table 1 below*.


# **Quantity and value of fibre exports**

During the year under review, a total of **28,463.30 MT** was exported to various overseas destinations, valued at **Kshs 4,670,949,883.77** or **USD 44,009,193.36**.

The highest volume of exports was in the month of July while the lowest was in April as shown in Graph 1 below.


<sup>\*</sup> Migori County produces fibre mainly by smallholder farmers which is processed by a factory within the locality for export market.

<sup>\*\*</sup> The others, represents counties where smallholder produces fibre from their boundaries and hedgerow for sale in the local markets. These include mainly Homabay, Kitui and Taita Taveta (Mwatate) among others.

In comparison to the previous year, exports were higher in the current period by approximately 28%. This could be attributed to better prices offered in the market as forces of demand and supply continued to play out during the period under review. *See details in graph 3 below*.

## **Price and grades**


The average price (F.O.B) was Ksh **166.06** per Kg (or US\$ 1,563.86 per MT) during the year under review. There was no significant change in prices in comparison to the previous year which was Ksh 166.70 per Kg (a very slight fall of 0.38%). The average prices (F.O.B) during the year month by month is as shown in graph 4 below, which indicates the highest average prices of Ksh 178.17 per Kg in December and the lowest average prices in February at Ksh 155.56 per Kg.

## **Export by Grades**

During the year under review, a total of nine (9) grades were traded in the export market. Grade UG was the most popular with an export volume of 115,186.15 MT, representing 55% of all fibre traded during the year, while the least traded was grade No.2 with only 32 MT being exported, a meagre 1% of all exports. Pie Chart 1: Export Share by Grade, JAN-DEC 2020



During the year under review, the highest F.O.B price offered was that of grade UG at Kshs **221,281.98** per MT (USD \$ 2,030 per MT) exported to Nigeria in the Month of December while the lowest price offered was Kshs 97,489.62 MT (USD \$ 900 per MT) for TOW. 2 in the month September, exported to Ghana.

The average F.O.B price per Kg (in Kshs) trends month by month for the four (4) main grades traded during the period under review is as shown in *Graph 4 below*.

From the graph below, it is evident that grade 3L, fetched highest prices per Kg ranging between Kshs 193 - 219/= per Kg.



Graph 5: Average F.O.B Price per Kg By Grade (in Kshs) Dec 2020


## **Export Destinations**

There were a total of 36 export destinations worldwide for fibre during the year under review, compared to 37 in the previous year. During period under review, no export of fibre were made to the markets of Abidjan, Oman and Slovenia) while two (2) new markets (Austria and Greece) made their entry.

The top five (5) destinations were led by Nigeria, followed by China, Saudi Arabia, Ghana and Morocco in that order as shown in *Pie Chart 2 below* 

The details of the other markets is indicated in table 3 below

The Nigerian Market maintained the top position as in the previous period while Ghana gained position one from fourth position, implying this to be a growing market.

### **Domestic Market for Sisal**

The prices for sisal fibre in the domestic market ranged between 50 - 100/- per Kg. This was the main market for smallholder sisal farmers, which found its way to factories manufacturing Dartboards, sisal ropes and twines and coffee drying clothes.

Although no data was readily available, a lot of fibre was also sold to handloom weavers and hand weavers for making local basketry and other artefacts
